






CAR mission is back to the Emergency Department





WHO IS WHO? WHO DOES WHAT?

Goodbye to Marius Musca,

Head of the Emergency Department who is leaving for new adventures!



In response to the 2013 crisis, MdM decided to intervene in the Central African Republic to support populations living in Bangui IDP sites. In 2016, following the stabilization of the mission and the improvement of the security situation, the followup of the projects carried out in CAR was transferred to the Africa Unit. Two years later and in an increasingly tense context, the mission is again under the management of the Emergency Department.

Today, the project in CAR is part of MdM's strategic plan for strengthening the SRH / GBV component by supporting the public health system in Bangui prefecture and Ombella M'Poko region. Support throughout the continuum of care is organized, as well as training and response preparedness to epidemics.

These activities are implemented in six health centers, including three in Bangui (Bégoua, Malimaka and Gobongo) and three in the nearby suburbs (Bouboui, Gbango and Liton) and in the maternity ward at the Bégoua district hospital.

Aurélie Leroyer, Desk Manager, and Charlotte Goetschy, Pharma Flying Coordinator, are currently in Bangui as part of a two-week assessment mission to learn about strategic developments of the project and operational issues.

FRANCE, Nantes - Emergency Response in a migrant camp



In mid-June, about 460 people had settled in the city center of Nantes. Faced with the inertia of the public authorities, in early July the teams of the Pays de la Loire MdM delegation decided to intervene. They requested the support of the Emergency Department by providing a medical coordinator, Marie, and a logistics coordinator, Pascal.

The objectives of the intervention were multiple:

- · Provide care to people on site and get a picture of the situation (socio-demographic and health issues):
- Call on public opinion and the authorities to obtain an answer in terms of sanitary conditions and accommodation as well as medical and psycho-social care.

Following the decision of the court of Nantes to evacuate the site, only 200 places of accommodation in Pays-de-la-Loire have been made available by the town hall of Nantes and several associations.

MdM is worried about the future of these people and the risks of rebuilding camps in the coming days and weeks, in Nantes or elsewhere in France.

NIGERIA, Mainok - Transfer of the health facility to the Ministry of Health

After one year of activities, MdM withdraws from the health center located in Maïnok. Activities are now managed by the Nigerian Ministry of Health. As of Mental Health and Psychosocial Support activities, they will be transferred to the World Health Organization (WHO).

In addition, MdM is about to expand its activities in Damboa LGA with 2 additional clinics that will operate in Azir and Gumzuri. An Emergency Response Team is under recruited and will have the responsibility for responding to new crises that may occur in Borno State (eg. new IDP movements and Cholera outbreaks).
